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SECRETARY'S PAGE

Well Friends, During 2023 we held just a few meetings in May, July and September and a great one it was in September with David Domoney, but of course that was quite an expense. The numbers were still disappointing despite having some great speakers and subjects. Talks in October with Roy Kenwood on Geraniums and in November with Jean Smale and some lovely Christmas Floral Art were good and proved popular with being held in the afternoon instead of the dark evenings and numbers were better. We used the Choir Room for Roy's talk but due to that being occupied with Foodbank Stock leading up to Christmas we had the main hall for Jean's demonstration and really needed that space to show things off well. We held the AGM meeting on 5th March 2024 in the afternoon but now return to evenings during the Summer months. I'm pleased to say we are still able to hold the meetings at the Methodist Church Hall. We said last year that the Methodist Church Hall was closing down but we continue there for this year. Please all attend and let's make sure we can look forward and get much more attendance and support this Spring and Summer, and of course much more help at the Show, which will take place on 18th August at the Pannier Market and marks 40 years at the Pannier Market but is our 56th Show and in fact 24 years since we started hosting the National Begonia Society South West Show. Fittingly we have Simon Inch as a well-known councillor and garden enthusiast as our opener this year and he is key in our obtaining grants which this April we have been awarded another £500 which along with the £1000 from Bideford Bridge Trust, ensures we can run the Show.

Meetings will now be every month with speakers booked for the most of the year and newsletter and website updates made as this occurs. July will also be the Show Preparation Meeting and we really do need a lot more helpers from the club. See out list of meetings and events that follow in this issue.

There are things to look forward to for us all and this years 56th Summer Open Show will be on 18th August 2024 and if we could run our own refreshments in the afternoon it would be great as it is a much needed and excellent income for the show. However it is a lot of work and failing that Carol and her staff at Pannier Pantry will provide this facility.

Your membership therefore now restarts following the deferred AGM in March at the same cost of £5.00. Make all payments to Bideford Gardener's Club and not to myself as bank charges are incurred by both club and me for such transactions. Use of the Post Office is also more costly and cheque paying in is also more time consuming having to fill out the envelope before taking a cheque to pay in. I think we should be looking for alternative methods of banking in the very near future. Mentioning the post office I for one and many others are finding the delivery of post very erratic. The National Begonia Society Spring Bulletin, for which I'm now the editor was posted from the printers in Lancashire on the Tuesday and my friends copy in Torrington arrived on Thursday that week. Mine took a full week before it turned up.

I have paid mine this way and it works correctly. What's more it will save the club money and I don't have to go to the bank or post office.

We look forward to giving a big welcome back to all members and we hope all will continue their or renew their membership and help rebuild the levels. Thankfully we intend to continue and this was the reason for bringing a big name for the talk last September. We placed adverts in The Link magazine for May, July, the Show in August and David Domoney's talk in September at a cost each time of £108 in the hope some of its quoted 12,000 recipients would respond and come along, however I have to say it was not worthwhile. We will advertise the show but rely on Facebook and the Website to attract new members, which I have to say along with word of mouth is paying off. I'll be putting postings in Westward Ho! and Bideford Community pages on Facebook so check there for details. The details are all on the club website but of course not all members have internet access. I would hope that members that do use the internet can pass on the details to their friends who normally attend and encourage them to come along for what we hope is a really attractive set of events.

Sharon Ellott looks after the provision of the teas at the meetings but we need some help to cover afternoons and liaise with Sharon when she is working and not available to bring the milk and biscuits. Dave Hopkins will run the Raffle at the meetings as well and we count on you to bring along some prizes for that. Pauline Spencer acts as our Social Secretary, taking a burden off myself and has the role of organising speakers and trips and is doing a superb job with booking the speakers for our meetings and getting Raffle prizes for the Show. We have some very good news for existing members or those rejoining after a gap for Covid in that the AGM agreed to organise a coach trip on Friday 2nd August to Taunton Flower Show, repeating a trip we have done previously with great success. This time it is even better in that members who have remained with us during the Covid disruptions, even if you've been missing from events, will have a free trip and free admission to the Flower Show. We will open this to other folks once we gauge the member numbers but for them the cost will be a very reasonable £30 for trip and entrance to the show. Please book by the June meeting to enable us to get the group rate tickets. I realise there has been reluctance to come out, especially of an evening but we addressed that with afternoon meetings in the Autumn and Winter months. As long as you have been a member and are rejoining you will get the benefits of the trip as it is you that supported the club and enhanced our funds over the years and this is our way of thanking you for that. As part of this meeting we will have our Show Preparation Meeting after their tips on the floral art classes and presenting vegetables and flowers. This year the NBS South West members have again offered to help in the setting up on Saturday afternoon, which we can do as there is no market that day we have booked the hall for two days. They will also help with the removal of the staging after the show. The show day requires stewards to accompany the judges and mark up the cards and result sheets for collation of the prizes and awards and we were short of helpers for that last year. FRIDAY 2nd AUGUST – TAUNTON FLOWER SHOW – free to members £30 to

guests. This is the first day of the show and always a great event in Vivary Park, right in the centre of the town and a lovely setting all on the level. The trip will start from Bideford at the pickup point near Victoria Park at 10.00am and with just one other pickup point at 10.30am Tesco Rose Lane, Barnstaple adjacent to Whiddon Valley Tesco, where cars may be left in a selected area but to be on the safe side mention to the store staff. We will travel direct to the showground and remain there until 4.00pm when the coach will return to pick us up and bring us back to Barnstaple and Bideford.
